My homeland is Djiliwirri. My clan nation is Daygurrurr Gupapuyŋu. My skin name is Bułany. I am a strong Yolŋu person who upholds my own language and has strong cultural knowledge and skills that come from my land as well as from my own *wakupulu* (great-grandmother) *māripulu* (grandmother) *ŋāndipulu* (mother) and *yapapulu* (great-great-grandmother) tribes and clan nations. These are my *yalu'* (nest) or my Yolŋu foundation. They are my bloodline and my cultural roots.

As a researcher, I am keeping this cultural foundation and connection. Knowing who I am dealing with, and how to use that knowledge in different areas, mean I am able to deliver research in a right way. I have access through my kinship to my own, and other clan groups. I can talk about some of the skills and knowledge that my *yapa* have, or my *māri* have, and through this deliver the support that family needs, that community needs. And that is important for the funders that you are working with, so they will have that understanding.
