






How you feel, how you look at yourself, how you are ready to step forward when you are given that task to be done.

Bringing Indigenous knowledge into policy practice


Yolngu policy practices...

- These are the practices of Yolngu Rom, Yolngu governance

"First Nations public policy workers and those delivering government services are often called upon to make difficult decisions in their work, designing, implementing, and evaluating the policies and practices of governments."


Have to look at the substance that is coming, and keep balancing the governance

In Northern Territory governance, balanda institutions work together


- Parliament making laws

How does Yolngu governance engage all these areas?









Bring to board area and its policies cultural values that belong to clan nations






In CDU work try to bring a reflection of work in other areas to help and support the previous areas – community, government and boards



- Yolngu people know because it's been created by a spiritual being that connects through dancing and through paintings. That's how Yolngu TO's know how to correct it


