

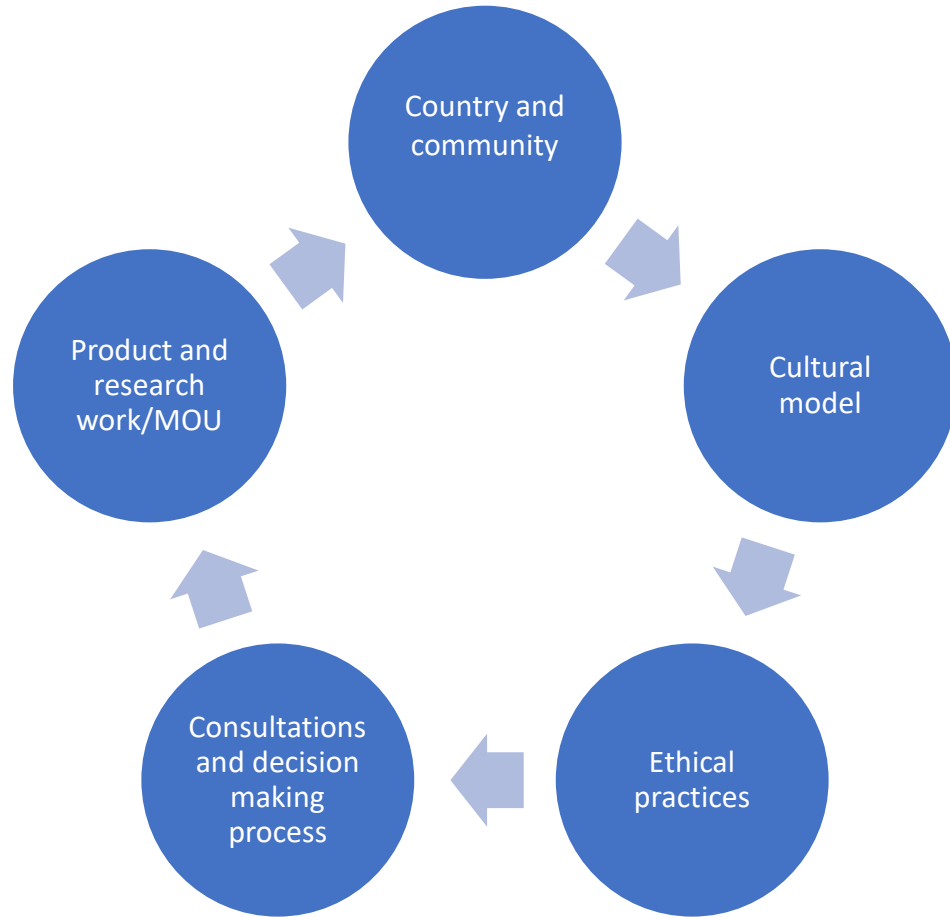

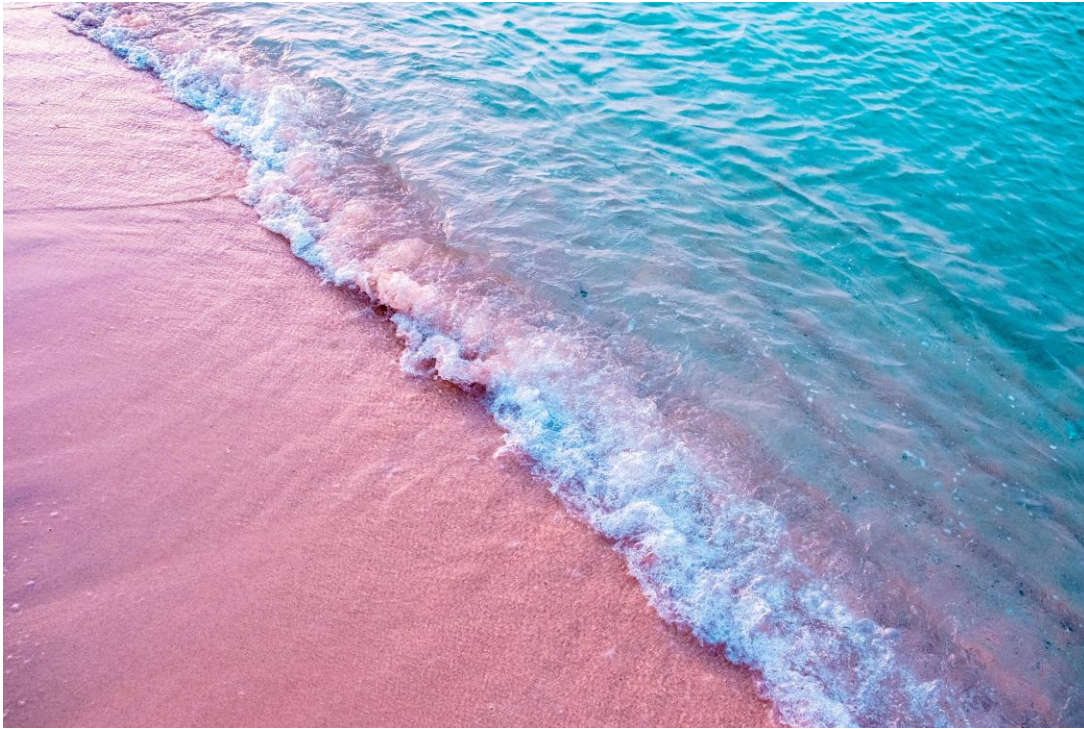

Principles guide to Research *Tiwi* Biodiversity & Sustainability The *Turtuni* Story



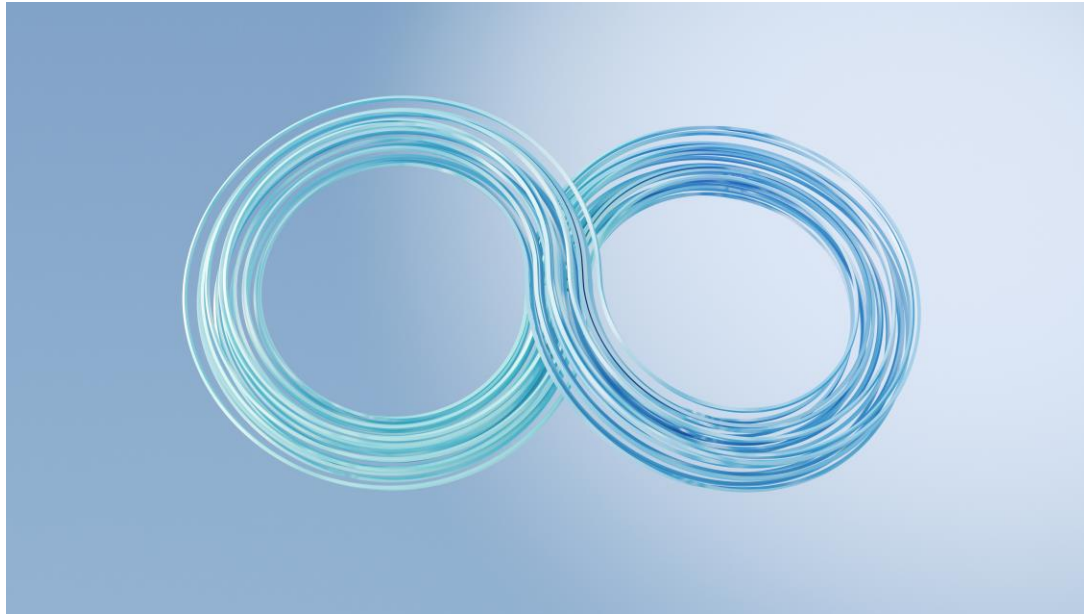


- Turtuni as a cultural compass for guiding principles on researching

Through you all it came and until in that **Yalu** you yourself, how many, you and Garngulkpuy and Wuluku were working, and I started learning within that then it started to grow until now” (Yungirrna’s video story)*
